The collaboration between the Club's Bantay Bata Committee chaired by **Dir. Frank Chavez** and the Makati City Government's Department of Social Welfare and Development under **Ms. Marjorie de Veyra** goes on, strong as ever.

The latest in a series of joint undertakings between the two partners was a two-day leadership seminar for young members of the Barangay Council for the Protection of Children. Held at the Hacienda R Resort in Pansol, Calamba, Laguna on 18-19 May. The participants were 31 very young members, with ages ranging from 12-16 years, of the Barangay Council for the Protection of Children. **Pres. Larry Boyer & Ann Tere** were there for the opening program.

Two topics were discussed on Day 1—the Convention on the Rights of Children and Other Laws on Children; and

Baby Rotarian **Rodrigo Segura**, who has covered a lot of ground in the avenue of Community Service since joining the club less than 2 months ago, took on an assignment under Club Service, this time as a program participant. Last week, as invocator, Rodrigo implored the Lord to “continue pouring His blessings upon us so that we may pursue our goals of lending a helping hand with unwavering commitment and determination to bring about substantial improvement in the lives of people in dire need.”

Club Functions and Committee Announcements. **PP Freddie Borrromeo**, chairman of the Family Health and Nutrition Committee, reported that his committee had given away bicycles to needy students at the Pacita Madrigal Warns School in Bagong Silang, Calatagan, Batangas on Saturday, 16th May. He also announced that this morning, he was going to Smokey Mountain in Tondo, Manila to launch another module of the supplementary feeding program, nutritional intervention scheme aimed at snatching children of pre-school age from the claws of malnutrition before permanent brain damage sets in. He also informed that according to project design, the committee organizes mothers them into little cooperatives and give them livelihood training so that they can sustain the progress in their children’s health after the 6-month feeding period.

Club Service **Dir. Henry Aquende**, who also chairs the Programs Committee, did as he had been requested to do by **Jolyon Tiglao**—announce that the guest speaker today **in Joey Panlilio**, executive director of Museo De La Salle in the De La Salle University in Dasmariñas, Cavite, and called on the Lasallians to come and give him a good listen.

John Aspinall, who is working hard to get the club, specifically **PE Felix Amparo**, interested enough in an educational project in Smokey Mountain

to adopt it during his term, called attention to the two articles in last week’s issue of Kaunlaran about said project—one, a news story he himself had written, about his visit, together with PE Felix and **Treas. Dayal Nandwani**, to the area in Tondo; the other a reprint of a story written about the project and the British lady behind it, **Ms. Jane Walker**. He described the condition of the dumpsite and how people, including children, are still picking garbage there, long after the dumping had been done there. The good news, he said, is that something is being done about it. Ms. Walker has built a school in a warehouse for 400 kids and is currently constructing a new school house from 40-ft. container vans, this time for 1,000 kids; the new structure should be up and running by yearend. He expressed the hope that the Club will support the project on a long-term basis.

PDG Tony Quila, chairman of The Rotary Foundation Committee of District 3832, awarded new pins and certificates to multiple Paul Harris Fellows, Pres. Larry Boyer and Treas. Dayal Nandwani—Pres. Larry for a new PHF for his grandson Blake Rory Long, Dayal for a PHF for his son, Rajiv Timothy. Pres. Larry is now a triple Paul Harris Fellow, while Dayal has 6 PHFs.

President’s Time had Pres. Larry making a correction in a story in last week’s Kaunlaran regarding computer donations that named him as a donor. He was not a donor, he corrected. He had merely given some money from his humanitarian fund to cover part of the cost of the computers and printers that were donated by **PP Fidel Alfonso** and **Taba Samson** and given to 4 schools in Tanay. He also explained how the humanitarian fund works, adding that at

Jose Ricardo Panlilio is the executive director of the Museo De La Salle in DLSU Dasmariñas, Cavite. A dedicated La Sallite, Panlilio is a Fine Arts graduate with a major in Interior Design. Joey, as he is fondly called by friends, descended from the Santos- Joven-Panlilio families of Bacolor, Pampanga. He was invited by the late Brother Andrew Gonzalez, F.S.C., former De La Salle president and visionary, to establish the Museo De La Salle.

Conceived as a lifestyle museum, it was designed to preserve certain aspects of material culture of the 19th century Philippine Ilustrado lifestyle. Situated in a lovely campus, the Museo encourages cross-disciplinary learning and growth in an academic environment. It is a living space that illustrates how the lifestyle of the 19th century Philippine elite to a large degree defined their era, their community practices and acceptable modes of conduct.

Mr. Panlilio started collecting Filipiniana in his High School years, a passion that led to the discovery, awareness, and appreciation of the Filipino Ilustrado.

Panlilio's continuing fascination with the 19th century Filipino Bahay na Bato, its architecture and lifestyle, had its roots in the yearly summer vacations spent in the ancestral family home in Bacolor, known at that time as the "Athens of Pampanga."

Panlilio is a dedicated Filipino Heritage and Conservation advocate while heading one of the country's leading museums and cultural institutions.

introducing laparoscopy in 1990 and serving as the #1 surgical diplomat of the Philippines over the last two decades.

Dr. Hilvano received his bachelor's and medical degree from the University of the Philippines in 1971. Following his surgical residency at the Philippine General Hospital he spent time at MD Anderson, Sloan Kettering, and UCLA. Returning to Manila, Dr. Hilvano rose through the ranks of his University, becoming a professor in 1996, and assuming the Chair of Surgery in 2007. He is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons and is a frequent visitor at the annual meeting. He has contributed broadly to the international peer reviewed literature in biliary and endoscopic surgery

More importantly, Dr. Hilvano introduced endoscopic surgery and laparoscopy to the Philippines, and became one of the leaders of laparoscopic surgery in South Asia. He was a co-founder of the Endoscopic and Laparoscopic Surgeons of Asia He has emerged as the leader of hepatopancreatobiliary surgery in the Philippines,

takes years. Among the administrative remedies he mentioned were a tax lien, compromise and abatement; levy and garnishment, forfeiture, sale of property, penalties and fines, and tax clearance. As far as the taxpayer is concerned, there are administrative and judicial remedies he can avail himself of. These include a protest of assessment before payment of tax and tax credit or refund after payment. Judicially, the taxpayer can appeal his case before the Court of Tax Appeals, and failing a favorable judgment, with the Supreme Court.

First, let me make a correction on an item in the Kaunlaran last week regarding the donation of computers to schools in Tanay, Rizal. My name was listed as a donor, but I would like to make it clear that I am not one of the donors. **PP Fidel Alfonso** and **Taba Samson** were the donors. All I did was provide some amount from my Humanitarian Fund as club president. This is a fund made available to the president to use for emergencies; it has allowed me and my treasurer, **Doyal Nandwani**, to attend to specific things that demand immediate attention, such as a donation for disaster relief, for which we get board approval later. I will be turning over the fund to **PE Felix Amparo** at the end of my term, with some P100,000-P150,000 that he will be able to use directly as well.

My Ann Tere and I were in Calamba, Laguna on the 18th for the opening of a two-day seminar for child-members of the Barangay Council for the protection of Children. It was a very interesting seminar and it was wonderful to see how the children, at a very young age, were thinking of ways to help other children deal with problems of abuse.

Last Sunday, the 24th, the Gawad Kalinga committee conducted a medical mission in Villa Paraiso. It should be the last GK health activity for this year. And I would like to thank **Fred Menzel** for organizing the mission and seeing it through, and **John Aspinall** for lending him moral support. My thanks also to the volunteer doctors from the Philippine General Hospital who donated their time and service for the patients.

This morning, **PP Freddie Borromeo**, with blessings from the Department of Social Welfare and Development, went to Smokey Mountain in Tondo, Manila to launch a supplemental feeding program. I am grateful to PP Freddie and **Ann Jojo** for all the work they're doing for our malnourished children. I also thank my **Ann Tere** for joining them at Smokey Mountain this morning.

Two TB Eradication Projects launched

The TB Eradication Committee chaired by **PP Puno Peña** presided over the signing of memoranda of agreement with two project partners last Thursday, the 21st of May, at the MRCFI boardroom. Doing the honors for RC Makati was **Pres. Larry Boyer**, while **Ann Angela Quila**, in her capacity as director of Kabisig ng Kalahi, signed for her organization. Kabisig is a partner of the club in its anti-TB program.

The two partners, which will execute the anti-TB treatment, are: Muntinlupa Polymedic, Inc., which will run the program in the Gawad Kalinga Sison Poblacion in Muntinlupa, and the Last Supper of the Lord Parish, which has chosen the Batibot, Las Piñas area for its project site. The two modules cover 59 beneficiaries, 17 children in Muntinlupa, 42 in Las Piñas and are both scheduled to begin their run this week.



Turnover of medicine

The other signatories were: **Dr. Elvira Aguinaldo** MD, Chairman Community Service-Department of Pediatrics for MPI and **Lilian R. Santos** MD, Department of Pediatrics UPHRMC for the LSL Parish.

The patients are to take a cocktail of medicines every day for 6 months, to be personally dispensed by a health worker, as prescribed by the DOTS method. The medicines used for the project are supplied by Natrapharm.

Dr. Boy Hilvano is first Filipino honorary member of American Surgical Association

In these times of bad news after bad, we could all do with some good news, for a change. How about this:

Boy Hilvano, has been conferred honorary membership in the American Surgical Association, the very first Filipino to be so honored. Boy is a professor and Chair of Surgery at the University of the Philippines College of Medicine and Chair of Surgery at the Philippine General Hospital. He is also the chairman of the Club's Medical Missions Committee which started in RY 1989-1990.

The award was given at the Association's 129th annual meeting, a black-tie affair, on the 23rd of April 2009 at the Hyatt Grand Champions Hotel in Indian Wells, California. Of course Boy was there for his induction into the exclusive organization. It is significant to note that the Association has at this time only 70 honorary members from around the world. The American Surgical Association



is the oldest and most prestigious surgical association in the USA.

Following is introduction of Boy by the ASA president, **Dr. Anthony Whittemore**, prior to the awarding of the honorary membership. Dr. Whittemore is the Chief Medical Officer of the Peter Bent Brigham Hospital of Harvard Medical School.

Serafin Hilvano, Chair of Surgery at the University of the Philippines and Chief of Surgery at the Philippine General Hospital, has led surgery into the 21st century, by
